Lene Jensen is a senior research scientist and professor at Clark University in Worcester, MA. Dr. Jensen is the originator of the “cultural-developmental” theoretical approach to research on human psychology. This approach encompasses what is universal and what is culturally distinctive about human development. In Dr. Jensen’s book, *Moral Development in a Global World: Research from a Cultural-Developmental Perspective*, she argues that humans are born with a shared moral heritage and that, as we develop from childhood into adulthood, we branch off in diverse directions shaped by culture.
