

Carol Rose is the Executive Director of the ACLU of Massachusetts (www.aclum.org), a nonpartisan organization that uses litigation, legislation, communications and organizing to promote civil rights and defend civil liberties, including freedom of speech, equal protection under the law, and due process.

Ms. Rose started her career as a reporter, working for *United Press International*, the *Des Moines Register*, and *The New York Times*, with stints in Washington D.C., Israel, West Bank& Gaza, Northern Ireland, Japan, Sri Lanka, and Vietnam. She was based in Peshawar, Pakistan, from 1990-1993, during which time she traveled and reported extensively throughout the Af-Pak region.

Upon returning to the U.S., Ms. Rose earned a law degree and spent six years as a First Amendment attorney before taking the helm at the ACLU of Massachusetts. She is a graduate of Stanford University ('83 BA), the London School of Economics ('85 MSc), and Harvard Law School ('96 JD). She is the mother of three teenagers.
